On Tuesday, 24 Feb 2015, the Public Procurement & Disposal of Public Assets Authority (PPDA) held the 10th Public Procurement Performance Review Workshop at the Golf Course Hotel in Kampala. The workshop was opened by the then Finance Minister Hon. Maria Kiwanuka and closed by the 2nd Deputy Prime Minister Hon. Gen. Moses Ali.

Hon. Maria Kiwanuka, the then Minister of Finance, Planning and Economic Development, opened the one day workshop under the theme *Strengthening Procurement Capacity for Effective Service Delivery*.

Commenting on the theme of the workshop, Hon. Maria Kiwanuka noted that worldwide, public procurement is often blamed for failure by agencies to implement most government projects in a timely and efficient manner.

OAG, IG, PPDA and GiZ to promote accountability



On 20th February, three accountability sector agencies signed the implementing agreement with GiZ for the project Promotion of Accountability and Transparency in Uganda.

The 2.7million euro project, sponsored by the German Government through their agency GiZ, targets the Office of the Auditor General (OAG), Inspectorate of Government (IG), and the Public Procurement & Disposal of Public Assets Authority (PPDA). OAG is the lead partner in the cooperation.

Over three years, the project will support the operational structures of the partner institutions, and improve effectiveness of public sector audits. It will also strengthen linkages between external audit, corruption investigation and public procurement.

One of the greatest concerns is the failure to absorb funds by the Government entities at the end of each financial year. This results in delays in implementation of Government projects," she said.

"The theme of this workshop is timely since there is urgent need for strengthening the procurement capacity in the different sectors to help solve the problem of failure to absorb funds. Enhanced procurement capacity will also help in effective contract monitoring by the civil society organizations and the media, which ensure value for money," Hon. Kiwanuka added.

The specific objectives of the 10th Procurement Review Workshop were:

- a) To review the performance of the Public

- Procurement System for FYs 12/13 to 13/14
- b) To share the proposed interventions under the Public Procurement Policy
- c) To discuss the experiences of stakeholders in the implementation of the PPDA Amended Act and ways to overcome these challenges.
- d) To discuss the challenges faced by various stakeholders and innovative and best practice approaches to enhance their procurement capacity for effective service delivery

At the end of the workshop, PPDA recognised the best performing entities for the financial year 2013/2014. National Water and Sewerage Corporation, and Entebbe Municipality were noted as the best Central Government and Local Government entities respectively.

In his closing remarks, 2nd Deputy Premier

Hon. Gen. Moses Ali noted PPDA efforts to promote good practice through rewards.

"I am happy that efforts of Government agencies that are performing well in public procurement are recognized and rewarded by the PPDA. I hope that this will motivate other agencies to perform even better," Hon. Ali said.

To cap the day's event, the Authority launched its 5-Year Strategic Plan, FY 2014/15-2018/19, which is already under implementation. The plan aims at enhancing service delivery for socio-economic development.

at the Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Authority (PPDA) opened the 10th Procurement Cadre Forum with a call for greater efficiency and emphasis on service delivery without compromising standards.

Ms Sabiiti commended the Ministry of Tourism for a job well done as a procuring entity. The Ministry had an overall rating of 3% -- the lower the percentage the better the performance.

"We would like to commend the Ministry of Tourism for doing well. They had all their documentation on file. As a PDU, if PPDA is to fault you, let it not be on documentation," Sabiiti said.

"You should always challenge issues...ask is this working for us? That is the kind of feedback that the Authority needs to make public procurement better," she added said. Ms. Sabiiti also revealed the PPDA plans to improve services to the Authority's stakeholders by getting closer to where they operate from.

"PPDA is opening up three regional offices to take services closer to the users. In April, the Authority launches the PPDA Northern office which is based in Gulu Municipality. Later in July, the PPDA Western office will be opened at premises in Mbarara Municipality," she said, adding that the PPDA Eastern office will be next in Mbale Municipality.

Participants at the workshop were also

challenged to be more diligent in their work to make the benefits of public procurement more apparent.

Addressing the workshop, Mr. David Kiyingi, the Acting Commissioner for Procurement at the Ministry of Finance, Planning and Economic Development, said, "The only way Uganda can achieve the vision 2040 is if the procurement officers do their job well."

"You are the centre of achieving all these things we have put down- the oil refinery and associated infrastructure, the airports, and all other great plans," Kiyingi said.

He gave an example on how public procurement can be used as a policy tool and go beyond just procuring and disposing items like furniture and cars.

"As you think of buying furniture, you should have a wider world view—how is your purchase affecting the forests in Uganda? Or pollution? You don't simply go for the lowest bidder—do they use child labor? Do they abuse labor laws and human rights to get those low cost items?" Kiyingi put it to the participants.

"Public procurement should not work in a vacuum. We should have social public procurement—in Kenya 30% of public procurement goes to women and youth, while in SA it supports disadvantaged groups under the Black Economic Empowerment policy. Public procurement should add value beyond just money," he emphasized.

Objectives of the procurement Cadre Forum in Masaka:

1. To openly discuss issues concerning public procurement which in turn affect service delivery
2. To share challenges and innovations made among the different procurement professional in executing the public procurement function.
3. To craft a way forward on effective service delivery in CG PDEs through the public procurement system

This annual event gives public procurement practitioners a platform to share knowledge and best practices on how to deliver government services to their stakeholders. A similar event is held for local government entities.

Baraza exposes challenges at Jinja Hospital

PPDA successfully held a procurement baraza in Jinja Municipality on February 13 bringing together public and private stakeholders in the Municipality. This is the third baraza the Public Procurement & Disposal of Public Assets Authority (PPDA) is holding after one in Tororo and Gulu in 2014.

The baraza, a public forum, gives stakeholders an opportunity to interact with their public administrators, the political leaders and the procurement regulator.

As part of a new strategy to promote accountability and transparency, PPDA has been publicly presenting its procurement audit and investigations reports at barazas.

In Jinja, PPDA presented reports on Jinja District Local Government, the Jinja Municipality, and Jinja Regional Referral Hospital. This function was held at the newly opened Civil Service College of Uganda, in Jinja.

During the baraza, the entity

heads have the opportunity to respond to issues and questions arising out of the PPDA reports.

The local people also have an opportunity to question their leaders and administrators, and agree or disagree with their accountability.

Also present at the baraza were local politicians, civil society and the media.

During the presentations, Jinja

Referral Hospital chief, Dr. Sophie Namasopo expressed her frustrations failing to achieve the hospital plans due to financial challenges.

“We would love to have a blood bank and oxygen plant but we cannot do so because of the inadequate releases,” Dr. Namasopo said.

She also sited the lack of accommodation for the doctors and other medical staff as a major

challenge in delivering services to the people in workers.

Area MP, Hon. Paul Mwiru assured the hospital administration and the people of Jinja that PAC would follow through some of the recommendations made at the baraza. One of the main issues he said he would immediately follow up on was that of ownership and security of the hospital land.

Gulu regional office brings services closer to the people

PPDA office will serve 23 districts, three municipalities and regional hospitals

The Public Procurement & Disposal of Public Assets Authority (PPDA) has opened its first regional office in Gulu to serve northern Uganda.

From quarter three (FY 2014/2015) stakeholders will not have to travel to Kampala for public procurement regulatory matters. Opening up regional offices is a deliberate strategy by the Authority to move services closer to the entities. This allows PPDA to serve all stakeholders better by giving the Authority's oversight functions to ensure efficient and accountable use of public resources for improved service delivery.

PPDA currently regulates 148 Central Government entities, 136 Local Government (112 Districts and 24 Municipalities) and the diplomatic missions abroad. The regional office will serve 31 entities of which are 23 districts, three municipalities, three regional

referral hospitals and two public universities.

Gulu was selected due to its central location among the northern districts to be covered. Districts in the north eastern region will not fall under the Gulu Regional Office due to their remote location from Gulu.

The Regional Office shall carry out the following functions of the Authority:

- Provide advice to the PDEs
- Monitor the performance of the PDEs through the procurement performance measurement system
- Undertake registration of providers
- Carry out procurement audits
- Carry out training and capacity building
- Follow up on recommendations from audit/investigations
