



**INSPECTION REPORT INTO THE PROCUREMENT PROCESS FOR COLLECTION
OF REVENUE AT LWANGA LANDING SITE IN RAKAI DISTRICT IN THE
FINANCIAL YEAR 2025/2026

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1.0 BACKGROUND

The Authority received a complaint referred from the Inspectorate of Government on 10th November 2025 in regard to irregularities in the award of a contract for collection of revenue at Lwanga Landing site. It was alleged that Mr. Amos Muwonge was the sole bidder in this procurement but the contract was awarded to someone else that did not participate in the bidding process.

In accordance with Section 8 (1) (i) of the PPDA Act Cap. 205, the Authority instituted an Inspection into this matter. The Accounting Officer was required to submit to the Authority a brief report and the complete procurement action file for this tender not later than Wednesday 10th December, 2025 which was submitted on 29th January, 2026.

2.0 OBJECTIVE OF THE INSPECTION

The main objective of the inspection was to establish whether Mr. Amos Muwonge was the sole bidder in the procurement for revenue collection at Lwanga landing site and if the contract was awarded to someone who did not participate in the bidding process.

3.0 LAWS APPLICABLE

- i. The Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Act, Cap. 205;
- ii. The Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Regulations, 2023;

4.0 METHODOLOGY

In reviewing the complaint, the Authority adopted the following methodology:

Review and analysis of the procurement action file. The following records were reviewed:

- i. Invitation to bid;
- ii. Bid invitation;
- iii. Record of issue and receipt of bids;
- iv. Record of bid opening;
- v. Bids submitted by Mr. Amos Muwonge and Mr. Girigori Muganga;
- vi. List of bidders awarded contracts for revenue collection in Financial Year 2025/2026; and
- vii. Contracts Committee meeting minutes.

5.0 SCOPE OF THE INSPECTION

The inspection was limited to the procurement of contractors for revenue collection at Lwanga landing site in the Financial Year 2025/2026

6.0 SUMMARY OF FACTS

1. On 2nd July, 2025, Rakai District Local Government ran an advert in the New Vision newspaper inviting interested bidders for collection of revenue in 26 revenue centres. The revenue sources that appeared in the advert are listed in Table 1 below:

2. Bidding documents for the 26 different revenue sources were issued to 36 bidders between 2nd to 9th July 2025, by Ms Daphine Naluwugge an Intern upon payment of UGX 50,000 a non-refundable fee. Details of issue of bidding documents are indicated in **Annex 1** and Mr. Amos Muwonge was issued the bidding document for revenue collection at Lwanga landing site.
3. The bidding documents provided for the requirements that each bidder was meant to submit either as an individual or as a company to qualify for award of contract. The evaluation methodology and requirements are indicated in Table 3 below:

4. By 9th July 2025, all the bids for revenue collection at various landing sites and markets were submitted and subsequently a bid opening exercise was conducted by Ms. Daphine Naluwugge and witnessed by Ms. Stella Katushabe the Secretary to Contracts Committee on the same day. The record of bid opening (Form 12) was not fully filled as it had the amount read out not recorded for all the bidders. The bids recorded at bid opening are indicated **Annex 2**. It was noted by the Authority that Mr. Amos Mwonge was the sole bidder for the revenue collection at Lwanga landing site.
5. On 9th July 2025, the Evaluation Committee evaluated all the received bids for the various revenue sources and markets and recommended to the Contracts Committee the best evaluated bidders for award of tenders for collection of revenue in FY 2025/2026 as indicated in **Annex 3**. Four bidders that were non-responsive to the evaluation criteria requirements were disqualified. Mr. Amos Mwonge the complaint was disqualified for failure to submit a filled

Form A 3 on financial statements, Form A4 on resource personnel and Form A6 on previous experience in offering similar services. All the bidders that were disqualified at evaluation are indicated in **Annex 4** with reasons.

6. On 10th July 2025, the Chief Administrative Officer issued a bid notice inviting interested bidders for the collection of revenue at Lwanga landing site, Agricultural produce at Kiziba Subcounty market, Agricultural produce at Mweruka Town Council market and Kibaati goods market with a bid submission deadline of 15th July, 2026. Bids were issued and received from the bidders indicated in Table 4 below and Mr. Girirgori Muganga was among the bidders

7. On the 15th July 2025, all the above submitted bids were opened by Ms Daphine Naluwugge an Intern and witnessed by Ms. Stella Katushabe the Secretary to Contracts Committee. Evaluation was conducted the same day, the evaluation committee recommended Mr. Girirgori Muganga for award of contract for revenue collection at Lwanga landing site for Financial Year 2025/2026 at UGX 400,000 per month.
8. On 16th July 2025, the Contracts Committee under Min: 03/07/2025 approved the bidders for revenue collection in different revenue centers that included Muganga Girirgori for Lwanga landing site. Details of bidders approved by the Contracts Committee are shown under **Annex 5**.
9. On 10th November 2025, the Authority received a complaint referred from the Inspectorate of Government in regard to irregularities in the award of a contract for collection of revenue at Lwanga Landing site in which it was alleged that Mr. Amos Muwonge was the sole bidder in this procurement but the contract was awarded to someone else that did not participate in the bidding process.

10. On 4th December 2025, the Authority instituted an inspection into this matter and the findings of the Authority are as below;

7.0 FINDINGS OF THE AUTHORITY

7.1 Whether Mr. Amos Muwonge was the sole bidder in the procurement for revenue collection at Lwanga landing site and if the contract was awarded to someone who did not participate in the bidding process.

7.1.1 On 2nd July, 2025, Rakai District Local Government ran an advert in the New Vision newspaper inviting interested bidders for collection of revenue in 26 revenue centres. Lwanga landing site was among the targeted revenue centres. The planned procurement schedule was from 2nd to 9th July, 2025.

7.1.2 On 8th July 2025, Mr. Amos Muwonge was issued with a bidding document for revenue collection at Lwanga landing site, upon payment of UGX 50,000. The evaluation methodology and criteria for eligibility of individual applicants/bidders were indicated as below:

- i. Passport photo;
- ii. Introduction letter from Local Council I from the area where the applicant stays;
- iii. Recommendation from the subcounty chief in the area in which the applicant had been working;
- iv. Trading licence for the year 2025;
- v. Experience in similar services with attached evidence in from of award letter, contract agreement or proof of payment; and
- vi. A copy of the National Identification

7.1.3 On the same day Mr. Amos Muwonge submitted his bid which contained the following documents,

- i. A passport photo;
- ii. Receipt of payment of UGX 50,000 through Centenary Bank;
- iii. An introduction letter from the Local Council I of Lwanga Parish Kacheera Subcounty;
- iv. A photocopy of the National Identification (No. CM85036109NPFE); and
- v. A trade licence certificate issued by Rakai District Local Government (issue date not clear).

7.1.4 The Authority reviewed the solicitation document and the bid that was submitted by Mr. Amos Muwonge for collection of revenue at Lwanga Landing site, and noted that the bidder was a sole applicant for revenue collection at Lwanga landing site. However, the bidder was disqualified at evaluation for noncompliance with the evaluation methodology and criteria requirements contrary to Regulation 5(1) of the PPDA (Evaluation) Regulations 2023 that requires evaluation to be done in line with the set criteria. Specifically, his bid was not fully filled and as such lacked;

- i. Form A 3: financial statement;
- ii. Form A 4: resource personnel;

- iii. Form A 6: Experience – relevant projects completed, and
- iv. Experience in similar services

Experience in similar services with attached evidence was one of the requirements in the evaluation methodology and criteria. Mr. Amos Muwonge did not indicate or attach evidence of the required experience as per the evaluation criteria. Therefore, the bidder was not recommended for award of contract for revenue collection at Lwanga landing site.

- 7.1.5 Following the elimination of Mr. Amos Muwonge, who was the sole applicant for revenue collection at Lwanga landing site, on 10th July 2025, the Chief Administrative Officer issued a bid notice inviting interested bidders for the collection of revenue at Lwanga landing site, Agricultural produce at Kiziba Subcounty market, Agricultural produce at Mweruka Town Council market and Kibaati goods market with a bid submission deadline of 15th July, 2026.
- 7.1.6 On the 15th July 2025 a bidding document was issued to Mr. Grigori Muganga for collection of revenue at Lwanga landing site and he submitted his bid on the same day by 9:10am. On the same day, the bids were opened, evaluated and Mr. Girigori Muganga was recommended to the Contracts Committee for award of contract for revenue collection center of Lwanga landing site in Financial Year 2025/2026.
- 7.1.7 On 16th July 2025, the Contracts Committee under Min: 03/07/2025 approved the bidders for revenue collection in different revenue centers which was inclusive of Mr. Girigori Muganga for Lwanga landing site at a contract price of UGX 400,000 per month.
- 7.1.8 The Authority noted that the bidding document issued to Mr. Girigori Muganga contained the same evaluation methodology and criteria for eligibility of individual applicants/bidders as the ones issued to the earlier bidders. The requirements were:
 - i. Passport photo;
 - ii. Introduction letter from Local Council I from the area where the applicant stays;
 - iii. Recommendation from the subcounty chief in the area in which the applicant had been working;
 - iv. Trading licence for the year 2025;
 - v. Experience in similar services with attached evidence in from of award letter, contract agreement or proof of payment; and
 - vi. A copy of the National Identification
- 7.1.9 The bid submitted by Mr. Girigori Muganga was complete with attachments as required in the evaluation methodology and criteria set out by the Entity. The bid had the following requirements:
 - i. A passport photo;
 - ii. An introduction letter from the Local Council I of Lwanga Parish Kacheera Subcounty;
 - iii. A photocopy of the National Identification (No. CM75065102PENA);

- iv. A trade licence certificate issued by Rakai District Local Government issued on 10th July 2025.
- v. Experience in similar services which included general receipts of Rakai District Local Government for revenue from Lwanga landing site for the periods; 1st July 2021 to 31st December 2021, 1st January 2022 to 30th June 2022, 1st February 2023 to 30th June 2023, 1st August 2023 to 31st January 2024 and 1st August 2024 to 31st January 2025.

7.1.10 Section 76 (2) of the PPDA Act, Cap. 205 states that *“all solicitation documents shall fully and comprehensively detail the evaluation methodology and criteria which shall apply.”*. Further, Regulation 7(4a&b) of the PPDA (Evaluation) Regulations, 2023 states that *“for the purposes of this regulation a “material deviation” is a deviation that; affects in a substantial way, the scope or quality of the supplies or services or the performance of the works to be procured; and affects in a substantial way, the scope or quality of the supplies or services or the performance of the works to be procured; affects the ability of the bidder to perform the proposed contract;”*. The Authority noted that the bid submitted by Mr. Amos Mowonge was non-compliant due to failure to provide experience in similar services, resulting in its elimination at evaluation. The bidder did not also fill out the key areas in the bid, such as; financial information and key personnel proposed by the bidder to carry out the revenue collection. These deficiencies constituted material deviations under Regulation 7(4) of the PPDA (Evaluation) Regulations, 2023. However, the Entity did not deliver a copy of the notice of best evaluated bidder to Mr. Amos Mwonge, thus, denying him the opportunity of knowing why his bid was unsuccessful.

7.1.11 Section 55 of the PPDA Act, Cap. 205, states that *“a contract shall be awarded to the bidder with the best evaluated offer ascertained on the basis of the methodology and criteria detailed in the bidding documents.”*. Further, Regulation 5 (1) of the PPDA (Evaluation) Regulations, 2023, states that *“The evaluation of bids shall be conducted in accordance with the evaluation criteria specified in the bidding documents”*. The Authority noted that Mr. Girigori Muganga participated in the second procurement process that ran from 10th July, 2025 to 15th July, 2025 and submitted a bid that complied with the evaluation criteria specified in the bidding document.

8.0 OTHER FINDINGS DURING THE INSPECTION

The Authority noted some irregularities in the procurement process for revenue collection at various revenue centres in Rakai District Local Government as detailed below:

8.1 Procurement planning and implementation

Contrary to Section 60 (2) of the PPDA Act, Cap. 205 that provides for a Procuring and Disposing Entity to plan its procurement and disposal in a rational manner, and Section 60 (7) requires a Procuring and Disposing Entity, on a quarterly basis and in any other case, where necessary, to review and update its procurement plan. The Entity did not include revenue collection in the procurement plan for Financial Year 2025/2026, neither did it review and

update its procurement plan, which leads into legal non-compliance, budget overruns and failure to meet planned objectives.

Recommendation

The Head Procurement and Disposal Unit and User Departments should regularly review and update the procurement plan quarterly in accordance with Section 60 (7) of the PPDA Act, Cap. 205.

8.2 Failure to adhere to the required minimum bidding periods during the bidding process

Contrary to Regulation 56 (1) (a) of the PPDA (Rules and Methods for Procurement of supplies, works and Non-Consultancy Services) Regulations, 2023, that provides for the bidding period of a minimum of fifteen working days for open domestic bidding method. The Authority found that the bid notice was published on 2nd July, 2025 and closed on 9th July, 2025 while the second one ran from 10th July, 2025 to 15th July, 2025, which periods were five working days as opposed to the fifteen working days provided for under the regulations. This may have denied other potential bidders sufficient time to prepare and participate in the procurement process resulting into limited competition.

Recommendation

The Head Procurement and Disposal Unit should always adhere to the requirement of minimum bidding periods for the respective methods of procurement as enshrined in Regulation 56 of the PPDA (Rules and Methods for Procurement of supplies, works and Non-Consultancy Services) Regulations, 2023 to allow potential bidders' sufficient time to prepare and submit responsive bids and boost competition in the Entity's procurement processes.

8.3 Failure to read out the total price of the bid at bid opening

Regulation 74 (1c) of the PPDA (Rules and Methods for procurement of supplies, works and non-consultancy services) Regulations, 2023, provides that, the information to be read out at a bid opening session shall be in accordance with the bidding document and shall include, the total price of the bid, including the currency and amount or discount. The Entity did not capture the bid amount as read out at bid opening. The section that provided for the information in the record of bid opening (PP Form 12) was left blank. This compromises transparency and accountability in the procurement process.

Recommendation

The Head Procurement and Disposal Unit should always have all required information recorded at bid opening in accordance with Regulation 74 of the PPDA (Rules and Methods for procurement of supplies, works and non-consultancy services) Regulations, 2023.

8.4 Failure to inform unsuccessful bidders, the stage at which their bids failed and failure to deliver copies of the notice of best evaluated bidder to all bidders who participated in the bidding process

Regulation 3 (2) (d) of the PPDA (Contracts) Regulations requires PDEs to inform the unsuccessful bidders, the stage at which their bids failed or were eliminated and the reasons for the failure or elimination. Further, Regulation 3 (4) of the same regulation, requires a Procuring and Disposing Entity to deliver a copy of the notice of best evaluated bidder to all bidders who participated in the bidding process. The Entity did not inform the unsuccessful bidders, the stage at which their bids failed and reasons for failure, and the bidders who participated in the bidding process were not provided with copies of the notice of best evaluated bidder as required by law. This denied Mr. Amos Muwonge an opportunity of getting feedback in respect of the procurement which was unfair and may have resulted into the bidder not participating in the second advert due to lack of information on the outcome of the previous bidding process.

Recommendation

The Accounting Officer should always adhere to the requirements of informing the unsuccessful bidders, the stage at which their bids failed and reasons for failure, and deliver copies of the notice of best evaluated bidder to all bidders who participated in the bidding process, as required under Regulation 3 (2) (d) and 3 (4) and of the PPDA (Contracts) Regulation, 2023.

8.5 Failure to reserve the management of markets to registered associations of the market vendors

The Ministry of Local Government Policy on Sell of Markets' Land, Development and Management in the City, Municipalities and Towns 2011 provides for the underlisted key requirements:

- a. The democratically instituted and registered market vendors associations (one umbrella association formed by all sitting and registered tenants for stalls, kiosks, lock-ups, open spaces, eating places, etc.) shall be given the first priority to redevelop and manage the markets;
- b. No private companies or individual persons other than Market Vendors' Associations shall be allowed to develop or manage markets;
- c. A management contract or Memorandum of Understanding shall be signed between the Urban Council and the Market Vendors' Association clearly stipulating roles, responsibilities and timeframes; and
- d. In the event that the Market Vendors Associations' have no capacity to manage the market, the urban council shall identify an officer among its staff, not below the rank of U3, to manage and supervise the market for a given period of time. The officer's duties shall include temporary management and control of the market and to nurture and build the capacity of the market vendors to enable them to manage the market on their own.

Contrary to the requirements of the above policy, the Entity awarded the management of revenue collection in Rakai DLG to individuals instead of promoting the formation of Market Vendors' Associations.

Recommendation

The Accounting Officer should open up the procurement for revenue collection and management of markets for competition with the registered Market Vendors' Associations in accordance with the Ministry of Local Government Policy on Sell of Markets' Land, Development and Management in the City, Municipalities and Towns 2011.

9.0 CONCLUSION

In light of the above findings, the Authority found no merit in the allegation that Mr. Amos Muwonge was the sole bidder but the contract was awarded to someone who did not participate in the bidding process for revenue collection at Lwanga landing site in the Financial Year 2025/2026. It was evident that he failed to meet the evaluation criteria requirements in the first bidding process and did not participate when this procurement was readvertised.

Mr. Girigori Muganga participated in the second bidding process as a sole bidder and was awarded the contract for revenue collection at Lwanga landing site after meeting the evaluation criteria requirements.

Therefore, the Accounting Officer should implement all the above recommendations made by the Authority in subsequent revenue collection procurements in line with Section 10 (1) (a) of the PPDA Act.Cap.205.
