

Cadre Forum "Work within Amended Law"

In May and June, the Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Authority (PPDA) held Cadre Forums in Masaka and Jinja respectively. Over 200 public procurement specialists from the central and local government entities attended the forums. From 28 and 29 May, the PPDA Training and Capacity Building

team conducted the 9th Procurement Cadre Forum for Central Government entities. The training financed by Financial Management and Accountability Programme (FINMAP) was held at Hotel Brovad in Masaka Municipality. The theme of the 9th Procurement Cadre Forum was

"Enhancing Efficiency and performance in Public Procurement through the amended PPDA Act 2003".

Key areas of focus were the Amendments to the PPDA Act 2003, Contracts Management and ways to increase efficiency in the procurement and disposal system.

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Average Price List for Common User Items

The Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Authority is mandated under Section 7 (n) of the PPDA Act to "agree on a list, which shall be reviewed annually, of works, services and supplies in common use by more than one procuring and disposing entity which may be subject to common procurement or disposal". In a bid to achieve this, the Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Authority developed a list of Common User Items for Works, Services and Supplies.

law, and to discuss how best we can improve on procurement and disposal performance,” Ms Sabiiti said.

The Authority held the 9th Procurement Cadre Forum that was organised for 150 Procurement Officers from Central Government entities.

This was done with support from FINMAP funding. Out of the 150 participants invited, 107 attended representing 71% attendance.

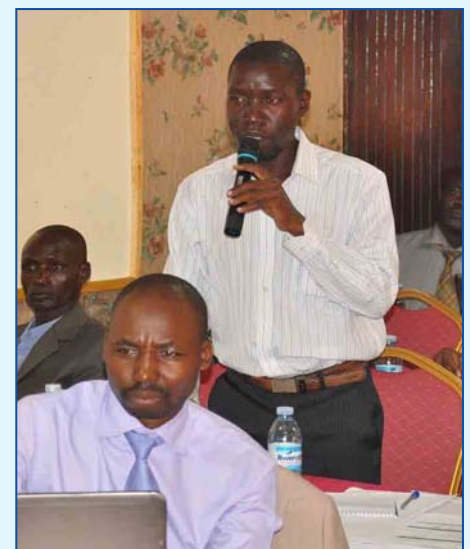
The main objective of the training was to sensitise the Procurement Officers on the amendments to the PPDA Act of 2003 and to share experience on innovations made to improve procurement and disposal performance and the whole public procurement function in the country. Issues that arose out of the training are highlighted in Table below.

Speaking at the opening, Ms. Cornelia Kakooza Sabiiti, the PPDA Executive Director, called upon the participants to conduct public procurement in line with the amended law.

“It is in this cadre forum that we expect you to give us feedback on the amended

The Amended PPDA Act and Regulations came into force on 3rd March this year. Ms Sabiiti also highlighted a number of benefits the law brings to Government, entities and the providers. Among these are Preference and Reservation schemes to promote local businesses and alternate systems for medicines and medical supplies.

Ms. Sabiiti also pointed out that the amended law addresses corruption and influence peddling, by prohibiting staff and line ministers doing business with their entities. She encouraged the participants to use the cadre forum not only to learn but also share knowledge on how to improve the PPDA Act and Regulations.

1.	Assessment of market price is difficult without guidelines in place.	PPDA to design a guideline on how to assess market price. However, entities are encouraged to come up with innovations on how they will assess the market price.

5th Procurement Cadre Forum for Local Government PDEs

The Authority held the 5th Procurement Cadre Forum that was organised for 132 procurement Officers from the Local Government PDUs. This was done with support from FINMAP funding.

Out of the 132 participants invited, 115 participants attended, representing

87% attendance. The main objective of the forum was to share experience, discuss practical issues facing Procuring and Disposing Entities and share the innovations made by PDUs to improve procurement and disposal performance.

The key areas of focus were

Amendments to the PPDA Act 2003, Contracts Management, Force Account Operations; Revenue Sources Management and Disposal of Public Assets. Issues raised during the 5th Cadre Forum are presented in the table below:

Issues Raised During the 5th Cadre Forum

No.	Issue	Response
1.	Procurement Officers should have an input in the Procurement Policy document being prepared by the Policy Unit of the MOFPED.	The Policy Unit promised to send a soft copy of the policy document to all procurement officers for their input.
2.	Most of the LGs are inadequately staffed and this affects the functioning of the PDUs.	PPDA promised to liaise with the PS-MOLG and Accounting Officers of the affected LGs to engage the Ministry of Public Service on the recruitment of additional PDU staff.
3.	The procurement function should be elevated to a strategic level in the Procurement Policy document	The policy unit promised to propose to raise the Procurement function to strategic level.
4.	At the moment LGs don't have Regulations and thresholds to use under the amended PPDA Act 2003	Local Governments were advised to use their current Regulations and Thresholds of 2006 until the LG Act is amended. However, the applicable provisions in the amended PPDA Act should be used.
5.	Participants rejected the proposal by PPDA to Share the Procurement audit reports with politicians who may have a conflict of interest.	Procurement Officers were counselled that disclosing Procurement Audit reports to the different stakeholders creates transparency, openness and accountability in the entire procurement process. After all, once approved, procurement audit reports become public documents and they are posted on the PPDA Website.
6.	There is inadequate capacity of PDUs in terms of office space, computers, facilitation to conduct market survey, etc).	PDUs should consult with the Accounting Officers who are responsible for facilitation of the PDUs.
7.	Force Account mechanism seems to be more expensive than contracting out and also does not spell out clearly the role of CC and other stakeholders.	PPDA has issued a Regulation on the proper implementation of Force Account. PDEs have an option to contract out a requirement in case the force account mechanism is more expensive.
8.	For revenue centres, bidders quote high prices for purposes of winning the tender and later come back to negotiate for a reduction.	PDEs should prepare contracts that provide for advance payment for a period of 3 or 6 months at contract signing, in order to avoid defaulting.
9.	Participants found it irregular to communicate Reserve Prices for revenue centres to the bidders	Reserve prices for revenue centres should be communicated both in the adverts and bidding documents for transparency and as a best practice.

Sensitize 100 CSOs and the Media on Amendments

The Authority sensitized Civil Society Organisations (CSOs) and Media Groups on the amendments to the PPDA Act 2003. The main objective of the workshop was to equip participants with knowledge and skills required in monitoring and accurate reporting on the implementation of Government projects/contracts. Out of the 100 CSOs and Media Groups invited, 83 participants attended representing 83% attendance. Issues that arose from the discussions are presented in the table.

Issues raised during the sensitisation of the CSOs and the Media Groups

No.	Issue	Response
1.	In the assessment of the market price, there may be a situation of overvaluing of the projects such as land.	Where the assessment is done, the AO is responsible to ensure there is no exaggeration. In case of land, the entity is required to use the Chief Government Valuer.
2.	Some government entities find it convenient to purchase second hand vehicles due to financial constraints	The PDEs are required to first seek clearance from the PS/ST of the MOFPED, before such a procurement is conducted
3.	PPDA needs to put in place mechanisms to popularize the Law.	PPDA sensitizes the key stakeholders on the Amended law, holds radio talk shows, media publications and is in the process of holding procurement barazas in different regions of the country.
4.	CSOs should officially be allowed to monitor government contracts.	PPDA will liaise with the OPM to follow up on this issue.

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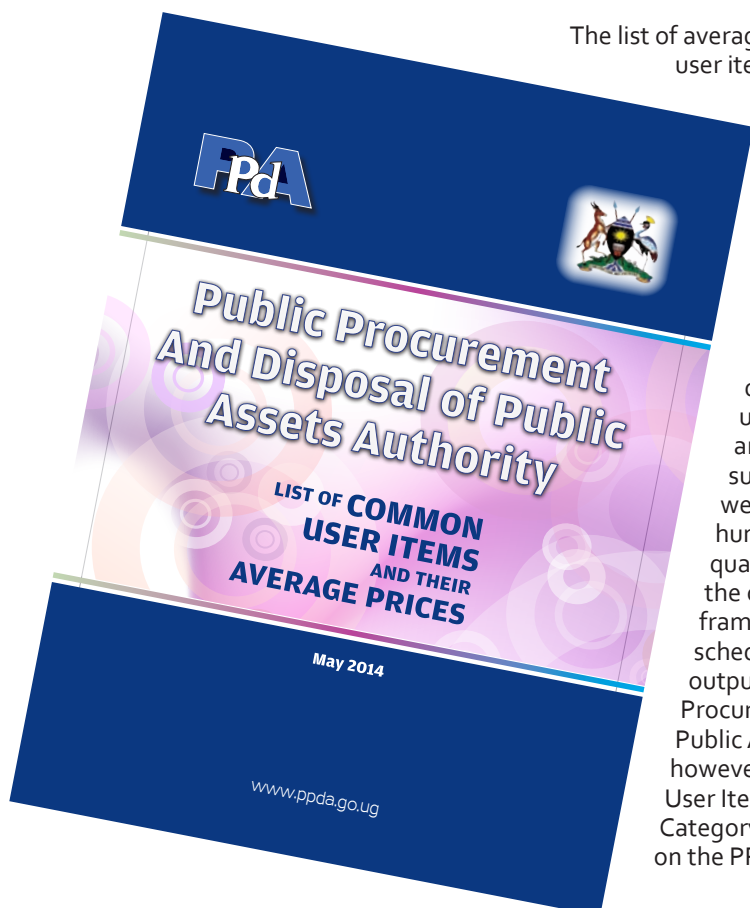

The list of average prices for common user items covers only the categories of Supplies and Works. The Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Authority has not yet compiled the average prices for the services category due to the diverse range of items under the consultancy and non-consultancy sub-categories as well as the variables in human resource such as qualifications, experience, the objective and time frame for assignments and schedule of deliverables/ outputs. The Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Authority has however developed a Common User Item list for the Services Category that can be accessed on the PPDA Website.

The Common User items list for works contains the following categories; Civil Works, Road Works, Water Works and Electrical Works.

The Common User Items for supplies were presented using the Integrated Financial Management System (IFMS) Codes and indicate average prices for items commonly procured by Procuring and Disposing Entities.

The Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Authority will update this list of average prices annually to accommodate price fluctuations.

Procuring and Disposing Entities are encouraged to make reference to this list when preparing procurement plans and evaluating bids to ensure that the public procurement system delivers value for money.

PPDA hosted the Ghana Public Procurement Authority (PPA) delegation during a study tour to Kampala in May.

On 12 and 13 May, PPDA hosted a team of officials from Ghana's Public Procurement Authority (PPA). The Ghana team was on a study tour to PPDA to share knowledge, on among others, the recently amended PPDA Act and Regulations.
